176 MINUTES

178 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME



The chairman invited questions from members of the public;

Mr Gordon Barksby asked if a microphone could be obtained for the hearing loop. He also asked what the situation is with the water tap at the cemetery. The clerk to Investigate the papers pertaining to Broomhill Lodge for clarity including Land Registry Documentation regarding the driveway. With a possible approach to the new owners & Broxtowe Planning.

Hall Om Wong – The hedge on the park is still suffering as water splashing is still having a detrimental effect to the hedges. Tarmac has been used but this is insufficient. It was thought more tarmac was required. The Clerk to contact Borough Cllr Owen to see if anything can be done.

STANDING ORDERS SUSPENDED

Borough Cllr S Easom commented that Broomhill Lodge needs lawfully to have access.

He stated that the puddling on the pond at Hall on Wong has been done; now looking at planting around the pond. He stated that tree preservation orders must be on individual trees.

Mr Gordon Barksby to arrange to meet Phil Wood (Broxtowe) on site to discuss tree preservation orders in relation to the Brewery Site.

STANDING ORDERS RE INSTATED

179 CARETAKER HANDIMAN

Two meetings have taken place to look at splitting the work of the handyman/gardener.

Broxtowe do all but 2 hedges. A final proposal is being prepared. NB gardens need to include the planters.

180 BABBINGTON

Cllr Plumb read out some correspondence from Cllr Owen and thanked Cllr Owen for his work on this issue. This issue has been ongoing for about 30 years. Neil Lewis NCC footpaths officer is aware of this issue. After investigation he will be letting the Council know the findings.

Cllr plumb noted that the notice board at Babbington has been damaged. The clerk to obtain quotes for new/repairs to all notice boards as a number with Perspex windows have become unreadable.

182 STAG – MAYPOLE DANCING
