Outside 134/136 Kimberley Road

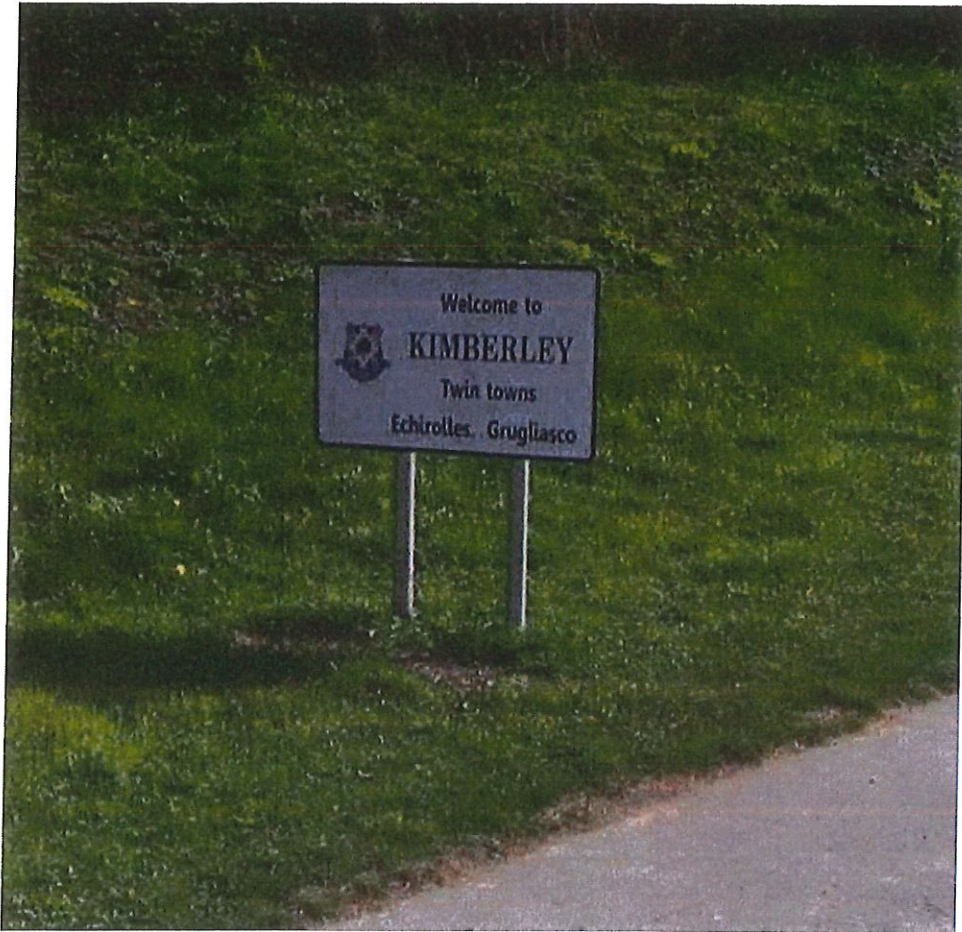

As you rise up Gilt hill from the shopping complex to Kimberley – opposite Amber Trading Centre



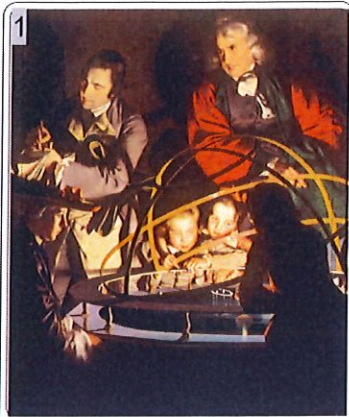

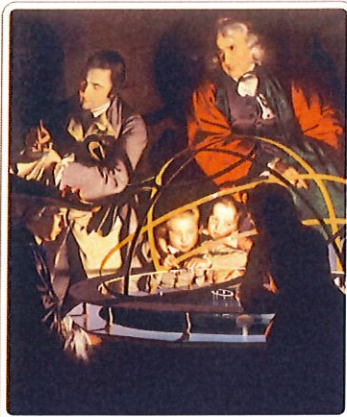
